Engage Schools end of year report

13th July 2023

Dear friends,

I'm encouraged about the impact Engage Schools is having. There's an obvious 'shop window' that supporters and schools can easily see, and I feel as if I'm achieving results with a reasonably high-profile, united event strategy in schools and with Stir Gathering.

Behind the scenes, there's a more careful, nuanced ministry happening, which I interweave with larger area thinking and relationships that might not necessarily bear fruit for a while.

Take, for example, the high-profile Lat Blaylock conference. We had Bridgnorth, Much Wenlock and Telford Schools together in Charlton with Ruth Watkins and Alisha Foentjies. This one project cemented a long-running relationship with Charlton school, affirmed Ruth's role in Charlton, and introduced Alisha to a key staff member in HLC, among other things, reported below.

Behind the scenes, however, I've been working on a relationship with a ministry called Kick, which specialises in sports ministry. The vision with Kick is to introduce them to schools and to usher in a new vision for sports ministry across the area. After nearly fourteen months of relationship building, we've successfully matched them with Telford Park, who will have a full-time worker from September paid for by the school.

These are just two examples, but I hope what I'm doing is clear.

Last September, for example, I brought Darin and Joy Stephens to Telford to introduce the Stir course. Over this year, three groups have started using their material, and Tim Carter invited them back to present the material to the entire church.

The main thing I'm doing is using my time to build meaningful, trusted relationships with key people and churches. This approach is slowly bringing more people into the school work ministry and opening up new doors in schools like Langley, who have not spoken to any of us since 2018, when I had my first meeting there.

Finally, let me add this comment. I believe the only way we're going to succeed in reaching all the schools in Telford and Wrekin is by continuing to support a united, relational school strategy. Furthermore, the only way we're going to build a healthy community of Christian young people is to do the same.

Personally, I'm committed to Engage Schools and the Stir Gathering event. I'm also committed to bringing tried and tested ministry models, leaning on relationships from further afield to make a more significant impact here.

This year we kicked off our schools mission in Telford with two days of health and fitness with a message of transformation through Jesus. Fit4life are the ministry we had come to Madeley Academy at Easter and this trip was possibly even more impactful.

The first school we visited was HLC (Hadley Learning Community) which was a real thrill. Telford Elim Church have had some success in HLC pre pandemic but have struggled to get the communication right with them since. Thankfully, Engage Schools has been able to assist that process with a project that landed at the right moment.

Mr Downes, the RE lead said: "That was a really positive experience. Thank you for provided our first RS enrichment!"

The following day we took Fit4life to Telford Park School, where Dan the instructor met with every student in the day. I don't know whether Telford Park just needed the encouragement or whether it had been a particularly difficult time for them, but I was surprised by how much joy the Fit4life visit bought the students and staff.

Lindsay, the RE lead said "Thank you Dan. It was the best day and everyone was buzzing." She later sent me a card which said "Thank you for bringing Dan and for all of the work you've done (for Telford Park) over the last few years. I really appreciate it. We are bringing the magic to the students!"

Finally, I took Dan to TMBSS in Bridgnorth. Unfortunately, due to unforeseen circumstances he didn't meet with any students. However, he did spend time with the staff sharing about fit4life and his faith in Jesus. In the end, that TMBSS morning turned into a staff enrichment session, which they were extremely grateful for.

On the 12th February 2023 we hosted our fourth Telford based Stir Gathering Event with National Evangelist Grace Wheeler preaching. Grace preached on the call to follow Jesus and the cost of being a disciple. By all accounts, this was a fantastic evening with a hugely diverse group of young people from across Telford and the region.

In some ways I feel that this was a landmark event, bringing in people from pretty far and wide who are catching the vision for what we're trying to achieve with Stir Gathering. There's still a long way to go in terms of establishing a movement of young disciples, but this Stir Gathering experience showed the potential of what we can achieve when we're together.

One of the most important elements of this event was that it was hosted by the Oasis Church. There were many things I thought were successful during the evening, but the most significant was that we able to experience the culture of the church and let some of our organisational control go.

During the evening many young people gave their lives to Jesus, and a similar number responded to the cost of deeper discipleship.

On 17th February, I was really pleased to be invited to lead a seminar for staff at the Holy Trinity Academy staff retreat day. There were other seminars, but mine was based on a reflective activity called 'Heart Psalms', which comes from a book called *First Love*, written by Brad Ringer.

I talk about Heart Psalms in my book, stuck in the mud too. It's a really helpful, prayerful activity, which I find cuts through our tendency to speak to God as if he has no idea what we really need to talk about.

I thoroughly enjoyed this opportunity and would happily do it again.

## Taken from Stuck in the Mud

A great mentor of mine from the States talks about how, if we love Jesus, then our 'first love' needs to actually be Him. He and his wife taught Louise and me that our hearts need to be opened up before God, like David opened up his heart. It's excellent teaching, but more interesting for this illustration is how they teach it. Generally speaking, they do it in groups.

One of the best parts of the 'first love' teaching is a practical activity called heart psalms. This is a 'heart psalm' that I wrote a couple of years back in a session with them.

Lord, my heart before You is growing. I'm so aware that You're moving in the lives of people that I love and I'm worried that I don't have enough of what I need to give to them.

You are God, I am not. Your love is wonderful, mine is not. Your plan is perfect, mine is not. You're a good Father, I'm too inconsistent. You are faithful, I'm distracted too easily. You are good, and your love endures forever. Students attending the day will gain an experience of university life. The teaching methods will introduce key ideas from faith in ways that provoke argument and deepen thought. Students will be involved in a collaborative creative activity.

We were thrilled to host this cross area conference, which included RE specialists from Bridgnorth, Much Wenlock & Telford as well as the chair of Telford and Wrekin \*SACRE and Shropshire SACRE member Jacquie Osmond-Smith. In addition, I was really pleased to have Ruth Watkins from St Christophers Trust and Alisha Foentjies from Telford Elim, supporting the day.

One of the most significant moments in the conference was when I was speaking to a couple of RE specialists in a break and it was commented that this event was bringing some joy and exploration into their subject area. Other great outcomes of the day included Alisha being introduced to the Hadley Learning Community RE head and Bridgnorth Endowed School's new RE lead gaining a greater understanding of what we do as a project.

At this point in the Stir Gathering programme, I think it's important to recognise that the power of good, highly invested relationships is a key to seeing God move in young people's work in the region.

We're now at a point where If everyone involved came to Stir Gathering at the same time, we'd have somewhere in the region of 130 young people and leaders. Given that there's only around 200 teenagers associated with Church in the region that's an important number, and one we have to aim for reaching.

I will always be as clear as possible about the vision of Stir Gathering: It's a place for leaders to bring their young people as part of their own missional vision for their growth. Individuals are of course welcome, but I care far more about the cohesion between us as leaders. It's that unity, I believe God is blessing.

This is our third project with Madeley Academy. The first was in 2019 when I took GSUS LIVE. The second project was in 2022 when we took an Easter Workshop, Fit4Life and our Reflect Room.

This year we offered the school two workshops, the first was Reflect, run by Beckie Dotson from Sutton Hill Church, Mercy Salifu from Chosen Generation Church, Geoff Davenport from Dawley Baptist Church and Madeline Prockter our student intern. In Reflect students spend time thinking about justice, forgiveness, peace, hope and identity.

The second workshop was run by me and it was the latest version of our Hikaru workshop. In the Hikaru workshop students listen to sections of the Hikaru: Name above all names book, and then learn how to develop characters and create story boards. During the workshop we talk about Hikaru as an allegory of the Christian faith, and explore the things the main characters are struggling with.
