10 video based sessions these groups will offer ongoing peer to peer challenge with a primary focus for young people to be reaching out to

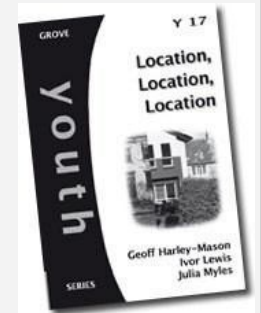

It is often easy to talk about youth work without reflecting on the significance of the location in which the work takes place. And yet context makes an enormous difference to the challenges and opportunities that are presented.

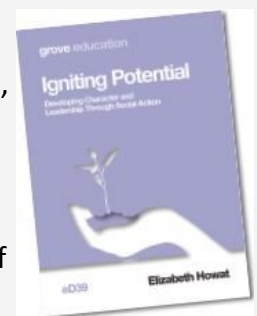


These three reflections highlight the different issues that are raised in different contexts, and they show both the dramatically different issues, but also the common themes that emerge.

The word 'education' draws on two Latin terms, 'educare' meaning to raise up or train, and 'educere' meaning to draw out what is within. Good education does both of these things.

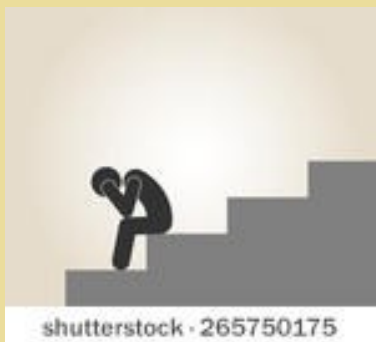
